Caux Round Table Japan organizes the Conference on CSR and Risk Management since 2013 in order to explore the possibilities of strengthening risk management by implementing the UN Guiding Principles on Business and Human Rights. This year, the Global Conference on CSR Risk Management will be held two times in March and September.

At the March session, firstly, the outcome of the Stakeholder Engagement Program 2013 and the public comments from diverse organizations at home and abroad were introduced by Miho Okada, Director of Caux Round Table Japan. This was followed by the presentation of four participant companies, in which they talked about how they used the outcome of the Program to identify adverse impacts on human rights in their value chain. In addition, the video message of Puvan Selvanathan, member of the UN Working Group on the issues of Human Rights and Transnational Corporations and Other Business Enterprises, was shown. The audiences learned about the latest global trend on Business and Human Rights as well as global expectation for the Stakeholder Engagement Program. Two Japanese experts, Makoto Teranaka and Hitoshi Suzuki, also gave feedback and their expectations. The session was ended with the introduction to the Stakeholder Engagement Program 2014.
