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#### What is Stakeholder Engagement?

Stakeholder engagement is to create a relationship with stakeholders (interested parties) in the global and domestic business operations of a company and to have a dialogue with them over various issues including any concerns they may have and the potential impacts of the company's business operations to local communities. Especially, in the way that the supply chain works, for example the employment conditions of foreign workers, child labour, the hygiene of work environments, and the health and safety of employees, these issues are drawing attentions around the world.

With a background like above, stakeholder engagement can provide an opportunity for a company to gain an understanding about their business and CSR (corporate social responsibility) from stakeholders, and for stakeholders to express their opinions and expectations to a company.

ISO26000, the international standard for CSR, also positions 'stakeholder engagement' as one of the substantial concepts. Business operations that protect the human rights of employees and stakeholders is becoming an essential task for businesses in the future. We hope this seminar will serve as an opportunity for us to consider and discuss how companies should develop their CSR activities and what kind of collaboration should be enhanced between internal organizations like CSR and HR departments in the future.
